

Because of that, we have asked our Overseas Partners to supply us with prayer points that reflect the situation in their country. Included in this edition of *Partners Praying Together* are the prayer points that we have received. We have included these so that you can show prayerful concern for them as they, who like us are 'wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world' (as the prayer from Compline puts it), adjust to living in a time of global pandemic. You'll also find the usual things we would normally have: the feasts and commemorations from the lectionary, the Australian Cycle of Prayer, and commemorations from the United Nations calendar. All the material is designed to inform your prayers for our Overseas Partners, the bishops and dioceses of our Church and for wider global concerns. With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).

Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). We have, as the well-used Anglican phrase describes it, strong *bonds of affection* for all of them. Because our overseas work involves both the Church, through our Church-to-Church Unit, and communities, though our Anglicans in Development Unit, we often relate to our partners both through the Church itself and through a particular Church's community development arm. Prayer Points from our *Overseas Partners*~

The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia

- ↔ We pray for all those struggling in Aotearoa New Zealand right now as a result of severe flooding and heavy rainfall. We especially remember farmers and the city of Nelson where so many people have lost houses and possessions or are faced with massive clean-up operations. We thank you for civil defence and emergency response staff for their professionalism and commitment.
- ↔ We continue to pray for nurses and midwives who face ongoing challenges given severe staff shortages across the health sector.
- ↔ We pray for the Diocese of Polynesia as it goes through the process of appointing a new Archbishop.
- ↔ We continue to pray for Tonga as it recovers from the volcanic eruption and tsunami earlier this year. We especially pray for the Tonga Episcopal Unit as it supports and helps communities to get back on their feet.
- ↔ We pray for tolerance and understanding given recent protests which are coalescing around anti-vax/anti-government messages. We pray for healing.

The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- ↔ Give thanks for the face to face classes of children starting this month.
- ↔ Pray for the consecration and installation of Bishop-elect Benny P. Lang-akan as the sixth Diocesan Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Northern Philippines on 14 September 2022.
- ↔ Pray for the affected families of the recent earthquake in Northern Luzon, and that homes, churches and other infrastructure be restored immediately.

The Episcopal Church of South Sudan

- ↔ Thank God for the safe return of all the bishops back from the Lambeth conference.
- Continue to thank God for the implementation of the Revitalized Peace in the country and especially graduation of the joint forces scheduled for August 30.
- Pray that the rest of the Bishops who are left behind could fly back safely and join their Dioceses.
- Pray for PEN (Pastors Equipping Network) in South Sudan which will continue for three years.
- ✤ Pray for all children in the Country as they are resuming their classes.

- Pray for the known and unknown victims of human trafficking who are still being held captive overseas. May they soon return safely to their native land.

- Pray for diligence in rigging and infrastructure safety, that no innocent people may get seriously injured or killed by avoidable accidents again.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN THE AMERICAS. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in The Falkland Islands, Antigua & Barbuda, and Grenada. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by the USA, Brazil and Chile.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord:

So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS AROUND THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Bahrain and Afghanistan. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Iran, Lebanon and the occupied Palestinian territory.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN SOUTH-EAST ASIA. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Myanmar, Timor Leste and Sri Lanka. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by India, Indonesia and Thailand.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN EUROPE. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Gibraltar and Ukraine. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Germany, Italy and Russia.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in the Northern Mariana Islands, the Marshall Islands and Nauru. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Japan, South Korea and Australia.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.
