

THE FIVE MARKS OF MISSION

... sure signs of God's grace in the world.

The work of ABM and AID is grounded in one or more of the Five Marks of Mission.

1 The first Mark of Mission

Witness to Christ's saving, forgiving and reconciling love for all people is a summary of what all mission is about. "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation..." (2 Corinthians 5.18). Thus, it is the basis for all the other Marks. As you read about the work of our partners in this book, we invite you to see it all as an expression of Christ's saving, forgiving, and reconciling love for all people, including ourselves. Engagement with the work of ABM and AID's partners provides us all with opportunities to be part of God's reconciling love. Particularly as we read about the Reconciliation Fund and the work of NATSIAC, we invite you to consider prayerfully what steps may be taken or may continue to be taken, to work for reconciliation with the First Nations people of this land.

2 The second Mark of Mission

Build welcoming, transforming communities of faith invites us to consider not only our own communities but also how we may work with our partners to strengthen their church communities in their own context. Our partners work through their local church networks, so stronger churches mean better outcomes for all. This is particularly so for ABM's Church to Church program which supports the Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea's Bishop Newton School of Theology and of St John's Seminary in Zambia, as they train the next generation of church leaders. These students will need to wisely lead and build their own church communities to overcome existing and emerging challenges.

3 The third Mark of Mission

Stand in solidarity with the poor and needy, brings to mind all peoples in Australia and around the world who do not have enough to eat, who lack clean water and sanitation, or who live imprisoned in illiteracy or lack of education. It reminds us of Jesus' own words in Matthew 25:34-40 about the importance of responding to such physical needs as if we were serving him. Supporting partner work under this Mark enables us to consider ways in which we may stand in solidarity with those whose lives are blighted by poverty.

4 The fourth Mark of Mission

Challenge violence, injustice and oppression, and work for peace and reconciliation, again puts us in mind of Christ's reconciling love for all people and calls us to challenge all that works against peace and reconciliation. Our partners strive to overcome practices such as child marriage, violence against women and children, lack of recognition of the rights of people living with disabilities, or the forced movement of people within their countries or to foreign countries as they seek to rebuild their lives safe from conflict. May you be encouraged to support them in their efforts and to seek to do likewise in your own communities.

5 The fifth Mark of Mission

Protect, care for, and renew life on our planet, makes a particularly urgent call to us as our world experiences increasing environmental degradation, sea level rises, and an increasing number and intensity of natural disasters.



BISHOP NEWTON SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY


NOTIFIED OF LOVE, HOPE STATES

The Bishop Newton School of Theology in PNG is part of the Modawa Institute of Higher Education, an exciting development, spurred on by the PNG Government's requirement for tertiary providers to be accredited.

Fr Leki Kambari, a 2024 Newton graduate, said that "Newton has prepared me very well for prayer life, pastoral work, and leadership...[and]...donors could make a real difference to the training of ... ministry [students]. Once ordained, they would be able to go out into mainly rural communities and help them to thrive".

Your gift will have a positive impact on students, like Fr Leki, who go out into parishes and other faith communities, strengthening them not only through proclaiming the Gospel, but also through leading and organising their communities, helping them to develop.

ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN SEMINARY ZAMBIA



Fr Austin Ng'andwe, from Chongwe Parish, Lusaka, is a recent graduate from St John's Anglican Seminary in Zambia.

He writes, "Being at St John's, I was privileged to be spiritually and professionally well equipped with pastoral tools for ministry." He notes, however, the college's challenge: "St John's has only six staff members including four permanent teachers. God willing...the school finds support...to increase the staff members. The students' hostel needs to be increased too, as the school can only train up to nine students every four years. The library also needs to upgrade...to help the students improve on their academic performance."



ABOUT THE RECONCILIATION WORK

ABM has a rich and complicated history of involvement with the First Nations peoples of Australia, including some significant failings. We believe that the task of working for reconciliation within Australia is integral to mission.

Our Anglican Church is blessed by the sacrificial ministry of many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglicans. These leaders are often working with vastly inadequate resources, and in situations of very high need. ABM's Reconciliation work strives to correct that inequity by lifting up the voices of these Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican leaders and channelling the generous giving of the wider Church to equip them to carry out the work they are called to do.

ABM believes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have unique gifts for our Church. ABM supports the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council (NATSIAC) and the National Aboriginal Bishop in their call to elevate the voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Church, and in society. We believe that the voices emerging from the struggles of people marginalised in our own society help us to hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church, and to prophetically imagine the future God is calling us into together.

Through its Reconciliation Fund, ABM provides a mechanism for NATSIAC to prioritise and fund local ministry initiatives by, for and with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Through its Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Leadership Fund, ABM AID supports institutions and initiatives which advance Indigenous education and self-determination, such as Nungalinya College in Darwin and Gawura School in Sydney.

Truth-telling and reconciliation are urgent missional calls for the Australian church. ABM collaborates with the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council (NATSIAC) so that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders determine their own mission priorities.

The Reconciliation Fund supports pioneering Aboriginal leaders, such as the Rev'd Gloria Shipp and her Walkabout Ministries, as well as evangelism, pastoral care, resource development and advocacy in the Northern Territory, North Queensland, the Torres Strait, and other parts of Australia.

CHURCH OF THE PROVINCE OF MYANMAR (CPM)



In Homalin, in Sagaing Region, 22 households now have clean, safe water thanks to a new well and water system. Training in hygiene and sanitation has further improved health, while education on gender equality has empowered the community.

In Hpa-an Diocese, women now run successful weaving businesses, achieving financial independence. Similarly, in Pyay Diocese, men like Michael Khaing Htoo were trained in motorcycle repair, helping communities stay mobile and self-reliant. Improved income also enhances food security.

EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN THE PHILIPPINES (ECP)





The Episcopal Church in the Philippines is transforming lives in the Philippines through two vital initiatives: education and sustainable livelihoods.

In Isabela Province, St. Mark's Children's Learning Centre is expanding to meet the growing demand for quality education: a new two-storey building containing eight classrooms allows for a new grade each year until it serves Nursery through Grade 7 by 2028. A campus endowment fund will ensure long-term sustainability, enabling the Diocese of Santiago to pay teachers fair wages and deliver brighter futures for students.

Meanwhile, E-CARE is building sustainable livelihoods in the wake of the pandemic and climate challenges. Activities include water harvesting, tree ecosystem development, solar energy, and plastic waste utilisation.

LEISA pig raising uses locally available materials like rice hulls and sawdust for pig bedding, creating multiple benefits. Farmers have seen remarkable results: healthier pigs + lower costs = increased profits. Esmerelda, for example, cut feed costs by 70% and earned nearly \$300 selling just three piglets.

This 'low external inputs' approach is also used for growing crops. It empowers families to thrive sustainably while strengthening community bonds.


