Who are ABM's Partners?

★ We pray for Aotearoa New Zealand as the Toitū Te Tiriti hīkoi (a walk from the top of the North Island and the bottom of the South Island converging in Wellington on 19 November) takes

place in opposition to the Treaty Principles Bill which is seen to adversely impact Māori. We pray for churches as they promote justice and reconciliation.

- We pray for Pacific delegates at COP29 advocating for a better deal in climate change negotiations, and we give thanks for the advocacy and practical projects supported by the Diocese of Polynesia and Anglican Missions in the SW Pacific.
- ★ We pray for young people who are struggling with addictions and mental health issues right now and we give thanks for the agencies and churches that support them.
- ★ We give thanks for Anglican Churches which are demonstrating their commitment to a fairer society by making land available for social housing initiatives.

- Give thanks for the 31 baptism candidates who received the Sacrament of new birth and the 71 confirmation candidates who renewed their commitment to Christ during the consecration of the Church of St. Simon and St. Jude in Brawar Batew, Municipality of South Upi, Maguindanao del Sur in the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Philippines (EDSP). Pray that The Episcopal Church in the Philippines continues to experience this encouraging growth in all its dioceses as they intentionally strive to teach, baptise and nurture new believers.
- Give thanks for the volunteer doctors and nurses for contributing their expertise to the Dental Mission & Medical Consultation in commemoration of the 24th Founding Anniversary of the St. Peter's Episcopal Multipurpose Cooperative in the Episcopal Diocese of Santiago. Pray that more health professionals will be inspired to respond to human need by loving service to the disadvantaged in their communities.
- ♣ Pray for The National Council of Churches in the Philippines (NCCP) as it calls on the Armed Forces of the Philippines, the Philippine National Police, and the local government of the City of Dasmariñas, Cavite, to cease all forms of harassment, intimidation, and red-tagging of the farmers of Lupang Ramos who are exercising their democratic and legal rights to defend their land, as well as advocating for just and peaceful resolutions to the many other land disputes besetting the country as a consequence of the unjust structures of Philippine society.
- Give thanks for the commendable efforts of those churches that remain open and functional to offer sanctuary to the people during the many natural calamities affecting the country this year, especially during the recent Severe Tropical Storm Kristine (Trami), and pray that the Philippine government will promptly address the urgent needs of the people by ensuring the rapid delivery of sufficient relief packages for each affected family in accordance with established humanitarian standards and principles; and that lawmakers, politicians, and the leadership of the land will prioritize the interests of the people rather than submit to the will of foreign interests and business profits that cause environmental destruction, such as large-scale mining, quarrying and land reclamation projects that contribute to these calamities.

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

The mouths of the righteous utter wisdom, and their tongues speak what is just. The law of their God is in their hearts; their feet do not slip.

- Psalm 37.30-32

As we come into the month of December, we invite you to join us to pray for the Church of Uganda (Anglican Communion) under the leadership of the Most Rev Dr Stephen Kazimba, the College of Bishops and to pray for all who share in the leadership of the churches in the constituent dioceses of the Church of Uganda. Join us to pray for the national, community, faith and sectional leaders in the country of Uganda who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nation that they would provide accountable leadership and stewardship. Join us to pray for wisdom for these leaders as they shepherd the people of faith and none, that being enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they would pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities, and clans.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

And He caused His people to be very fruitful; and made them stronger than their adversaries.

— Psalm 105.24

In the second week of the month, we pray for the fruitfulness, health and mercy for God's people in the Church of Uganda and its constituent dioceses. We pray that they will increase, multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and illnesses. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by their current challenges occasioned by both human and natural causes, those affected by conflict and insurgency in the border towns with D.R. Congo and other countries, for the many who are displaced and the many taking refuge within the country of Uganda. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenging situations in the constituent dioceses of the Church of Uganda. Join us to pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and

psychologically within the dioceses of the Church of Uganda and their communities. We pray for the ministries of the various groups in the Church, the Mothers' Union, the Men's Ministries, the Youth and Children ministries as well as the ministries of theological education and others, that they all will be sources of healing and fruitfulness.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

In the third week of the month of December, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of Uganda, as a country and for the communities and dioceses of the Anglican Church. We pray for the peaceful co-existence of the various tribal and faith groups in Uganda and between the country and its neighbours. We pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nation and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that Uganda and its peoples will know and experience the peace of Christ in the challenging political and socioeconomic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well as political parties and faith groups in the country and for the betterment of the nation and its people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

- Colossians 3.14

In the fourth week of the month, our prayer is for an endearing love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses in the Church of Uganda and in the nation. We pray for love among people of differing faiths, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses of the Church and in the country as a whole. Join us to pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and faith, tribal and social communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Thanksgiving and Celebration

♣ Anglican Diocese of Eastern Zambia

We celebrate the ministry of the Gender Action Group (GAG) and Gender Committee members (which includes some Headmen and Headwomen) at the Kamwanda site in Sinda who have received bicycles from the diocese through Zambia Anglican Council Outreach Program (ZACOP). The bicycles are to facilitate the work of the beneficiaries as they carry out their gender programmes. The Gender Action programmes by ZACOP aim at contributing to reducing the incidence of Gender-based Violence and its associated negative impacts within the Kamwanda and its outlying communities. The ZACOP Gender Action programme is being supported by the Australian Board of Mission (ABM) and Anglicans in Development (AID) of the Anglican Church in Australia.

- Anglican Church of Southern Africa
 - We join the Youth of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa to give thanks to God and celebrate the election of the Immediate Past Provincial Youth President, Ms Lulama Ntuta on her election as the First Vice-President of the South Africa Council of Churches. Join us to pray for God's guidance and counsel as she takes up this honouring responsibility to serve the Church and the State in South Africa.
- Anglican Diocese of Katanga Democratic Repuiblic of Congo
 We join the Bishop and the faithful in the Diocese of Katanga to offer thanks to God
 for the success of the Diocesan Synod which ratified the motion to carve out the new
 Diocese of Kalemie and for the election and confirmation of the Rev Dr KAHWA
 Njojo as the first Bishop of the new Diocese. The new Diocese of Kalemie in D. R.
 Congo is along Lake Tanganyika near Tanzania and Burundi. We wish the new Bishop
 well in his new role and ministry among the people and the Christians of that part of
 Congo.
- Church of Nigeria (Anglican Communion)
 - Join us to pray for the upcoming inaugural summit of The Anglican Students' Evangelical Fellowship (ASEF), a merger of the Anglican Students' Fellowship (ASF) and Evangelical Fellowship in the Anglican Communion Students' Ministry (EFACSM), a unified force to take the gospel of salvation and discipleship approaches to various campuses across Nigeria and beyond. The summit will take place at the Archbishop Peter Jasper Akinola Foundation Youth Centre, Abeokuta, Ogun State from Thursday, 7th to Sunday, 10th November, 2024 and will bring together students and Alumni leaders from both fellowships as they gather to hear God's heartbeat, learn under heaven's cloud and receive direction from the Holy Spirit for the years ahead as touching Christian ministry on campus and outreaches.

Episcopal Church of South Sudan:

We celebrate as we join the Episcopal Church of South Sudan (Anglican Communion) to give thanks to God for the service of celebration of the creation of the Province and for the rededication of the renovated Mission and Evangelism Office. Join us to pray for the leadership of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan and its mission efforts, especially in Education and Evangelism, both of which are avenues and tools for achieving lasting and enduring peace in the nation of South Sudan.

Join us to give thanks to God for the successful meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Anglican Alliance held at Christ Church, Jebel Ali, Dubai in the United Arab Emirates. Among the business of the meeting was the formal reception of the new Executive Director of the Alliance, Mr Robert Dawes and to bid farewell to the outgoing Executive Director, the Rev Canon Rachel Carnegie who had served in the role for the last ten years. The Trustees were formally welcomed by the Bishop of Cyprus and the Gulf, the Rt Rev Sean Semple while the meeting was hosted under the auspices of the Parish Priest, the Reverend Jim Young, who described his ministry as carried out through Christ Church. Bishop Sean presided at the closing Eucharist on Friday (18th October).

The Church of the Province of Central Africa:

Following the resolution of the Provincial Synod to create new dioceses in Malawi, the Provincial assessment team has begun sitting in the Anglican Diocese of Lake Malawi to ascertain the viability and sustainability of the proposed new dioceses. The motivation is generally for church growth in Malawi. Join us to pray for the team which is being led by the Dean of the Province, The Rt Rev Dr Farai Mutamiri. Let us pray that their engagements and assessments will lead to viable conclusions that will uplift God's Church in the country of Malawi.

We join the Bishop, Clergy and the Lay Faithful of the Anglican Diocese of Eswatini to give thanks to God for the growth and expansion of the mission and ministry of the Church in the country. We thank God for the service of administration of the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Renewal of Licences of Lay Ministers held in the parish of St Phillip and St James, Luyengo. We rejoice at the enthusiastic uptake of the Church and Community Mobilization Process Tool in the diocese and for the work of the Champions in this regard.

Diocese of Nairobi - Anglican Church of Kenya:

We join the Christians in the Diocese of Nairobi to pray and welcome their Commissary Bishop, the Rt Rev Francis Matui, the Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Makueni. Bishop Matui, as Commissary Bishop of the Diocese of Nairobi, will provide spiritual oversight and episcopal leadership of the Nairobi diocese during the period of interregnum as they prepare to elect a successor Bishop to the retired Rt Rev Joel

Waweru. The Bishop Commissary was introduced to the Diocesan Standing Committee by the Archbishop, the Most Rev Dr Jackson Ole Sapit. Join us to pray for God's grace and godly counsel as he leads the diocese through the transition process

High Anglican Development Services – Eastern – Anglican Church of Kenya With gratitude to God, we join the ADSE to give thanks and honour the Rt Rev Joseph Mutungi(outgoing Bishop of Machakos) and the Rt Rev David Mutisya (outgoing Bishop of Garrisa) for their leadership and service as the Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively of the Board of Trustees of ADSE. We join in thanksgiving to God for the success of the 18th AGM of ADSE and for the ground-breaking for the construction of the Holy Trinity Chapel in the compound of the ADSE Headquarters. Join us to pray for God's continued grace for the two Bishops as they bow out of their leadership roles and pray for those coming into take their places. Let us pray for the Executive Director of ADSE and his team and for the communities they are working with to bring about sustainable livelihoods, climate-smart agriculture and the other innovations being championed through the ADSE and Machakos, Makeni, Kituie and Garrisa.

♣ Anglican Health and Community Network (AHCN)

The Anglican Health and Community Network brings together persons and institutions involved in health and healing ministries in various provinces to share fellowship, learnings and best practices as well as explore innovative ways to enhance the health and healing ministries of the Church in the various provinces. The Working Group of the Network met in Hong Kong from 11th to 15th October to strategize on the roll-out of the plans and activities of the Network. CAPA (as a member of the Working Group) is initiating the CAPA Health Network as a platform to facilitate both the upward and downward cascading of the sharing and learnings from the global Working Group. African Primates have been requested to nominate provincial representatives to join the network and we look forward to holding an online session to plan and strategize in early January. Please pray for the start of this ministry even as we look to God, the Great Physician, to send us His help, wisdom and fruitfulness of this ministry.

♣ Anglican Diocese of Upper Shire - Malawi

We join the Diocese of Upper Shire(Malawi) to celebrate and offer into God's care the ministry of Financial Literacy and Economic Empowerment being undertaken for both men and women under the auspices of Hope International and under the leadership of the Rev Father Sandress Mganja of the Parish of St. Mary, Samama.
