
- Thanksgiving for the Ceasefire in the Gaza War, with prayers for the adoption of its later phases, bringing the war to an end

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

— Hebrews 13.7

As we continue to come into the new year with grateful hearts, we seek the face of our gracious Lord who walked with us (through thick and thin) in 2024. We experienced His bounteous graces and mercies as we prayed for our members and our leaders. As we commence the year, we bring before God the Episcopal Church of Alexandria under the leadership of the Most Rev Dr Samy Fouzy Shehata. We remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and Lay Leaders who (together with the Primate) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Church and their communities. We remember in particular the dioceses of North Africa and the Horn of Africa, the Church in Ethiopia and Egypt and all communities where the ministry of the Church is shared. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal and sectional leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nations. Let us pray that the leaders will provide accountable leadership and stewardship. Join us to pray for wisdom for the leaders as they shepherd the people of faith and none, that being enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they would pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. — Isaiah 40.29

In the second week of the month, we pray for fruitfulness, good health and mercy for God's people in the Episcopal Church of Alexandria and its constituent dioceses and countries. We pray that the countries and their peoples will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the current challenges occasioned by both human and natural causes, those affected by political and economic instability in the countries of the province. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenging situations in the constituent countries and dioceses of the province and for those who have been displaced and are being hosted by the Church in Egypt and other countries. Join us to pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the province and their communities. We remember and pray for the ministries of the various groups in the Church, the Mothers' Union, the Mens' Ministries, the Youth and Children's ministries as well as the ministries of theological education and others, that they all will be sources of healing and fruitfulness both physically and spiritually.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. — Galatians 5.22-23

In the third week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of the Church and the constituent countries of the province of Alexandria. We pray for the peaceful co-existence of the various political, tribal and faith groups in the constituent countries of the province and between the countries and their neighbours. We pray for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups and pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the countries within the province and their peoples will know and experience the peace of Christ in their challenging political and socio-economic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well as political parties and faith groups in the countries and for the betterment of the nations and their people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Let all that you do be done in love.

- 1 Corinthians 16.14

In the fourth week of February, we pray for enduring love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses and countries in the Episcopal Church of Alexandria. Join us to pray for love among people of differing faiths, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and countries of the province. We pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Thanksgiving and Celebration

- # Episcopal Church of South Sudan
 - We join the Episcopal Church of South Sudan to give thanks to God for the successful launch of their 'Climate Change Resilience' project in Juba emphasizing the Christians' role in creation care. The initiative aims to promote climate justice and provide support to the Green Anglicans South Sudan and to encourage all dioceses to uphold God's command to be stewards of creation. The project in addition seeks to raise awareness and build skills to empower communities in flood-prone areas to build resilience and safety during the annual rainy season.
- Episcopal Diocese of Egypt
 - We give thanks to God for the successful graduation of the leaders and employees of the 'Basic Counselling Training' programme run by the Family Service Committee in Abrushia of the Episcopal Diocese of Egypt. The graduation was attended by the Archbishop, the Most Rev Dr Samy Fouzy Shehata with the support of other leaders. The Anglican Diocese of Egypt hosts a large community of Sudanese migrants in Cairo and in other locations in Egypt. The community holds its services in the All Saints' Cathedral, Zamalek in Cairo where they also receive various support services including skills training, healthcare, counselling and educational support. We join the Diocese of Egypt to give thanks to God for the successful admission of 16 new members into the communion and membership of the church at a service held at the St John the Baptist Episcopal Church in Maadi. Ministering with the Archbishop was the Rev Emmanuel Sabana and other ministers who support the Sudanese ministries in Egypt.

We join the Anglican Diocese of Accra to give thanks for the successful induction into office of the 12th President and Executives of the Anglican Women's Fellowship (AWF) for the 2024-2028 term. The induction ceremony, under the theme: 'Being Relevant at All Times' (Matthew5:16), took place at the St Joseph the Worker Anglican Church, Kaneshie, Accra. The newly inducted president, Mrs Caroline Naa Dodua Kotei-Robertson, leads a team of committed women poised to champion the mission of the fellowship. 
