Who are ABM's Partners?

- Prayers for a speedy end to the war with a negotiated settlement




The Anglican Church of Kenya




The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- Give thanks for the initial meetings between leaders of The Episcopal Church in the Philippines, *Iglesia Filipina Independiente* (Philippine Independent Church), and *Iglesia Unida Ekyumenikal* (United Ecumenical Church) as they look into the possibility of establishing a covenant of partnership for mission, and pray that as they attempt to build up Christ's kingdom together that the default mode of churches should always be towards Christian unity.
- Give thanks for 120 years of St Mary's School of Sagada in the Episcopal Diocese of Northern Philippines and pray that while it honours its heritage, it will embrace a progressive future.
- Give thanks for the encouraging passing results of all nursing graduates from ECP institutions in the November 2024 Philippine Nurses Licensure Examination: St Luke's College of Nursing at Trinity University of Asia (99.19%), Easter College Department of Nursing (97.93%), and Brent College of Nursing at Brent Hospital & Colleges (81.98%), and pray that they will be inspired to respond to human need by loving service throughout their new careers.
- Give thanks for the official announcement that Ms Mary Jane Veloso, who has been on death row in Indonesia for the past 14 years, will be transferred back to the Philippines, and pray with Migrante International that President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. will demonstrate compassion for a victim of human trafficking by granting Mary Jane clemency and that her traffickers in the Philippines will be held fully accountable.
- Give thanks for the participation of the National Council of Churches in the Philippines (NCCP) in the 2024 United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP29) as it strives to uphold its values of truth, justice, and solidarity which strengthen its resolve for climate action and ecological justice; and pray that the demand by communities for accountability and rights will be listened to, major polluters will fulfill their moral and historical obligations and debt to humanity through sufficient, concrete and people-centered climate finance, and that there will be support for the global call to phaseout fossil fuels through the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty.

We invite you to join us to pray for the Church of the Province of West Africa (CPWA) under the primatial leadership of the Most Rev Dr Cyril Kobina Ben-Smith, the College of Bishops and to pray for all who share in the leadership of the churches in the constituent dioceses and countries of CPWA. Join us to pray for the national, community, faith and sectional leaders in the countries of the provinces (Cameroon, Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Guinea and The Gambia) who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nations. Let us pray that the leaders will provide accountable leadership and stewardship. Join us to pray for wisdom for the leaders as they shepherd the people of faith and none, that being enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they would pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities, and clans.



WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

So that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God.

— Colossians 1.10

In the second week of the month, we pray for the fruitfulness, health and mercy for God's people in the Church of the Province of West Africa and its constituent dioceses and countries. We pray that the countries and their peoples will increase, multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and illnesses. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the recurrent challenges occasioned by both human and natural causes, those affected by political and economic instability in the countries of the province, for those affected by the stadium mishap in Guinea and other such incidents in other countries within the province. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenging situations in the constituent countries and dioceses of the province and for the healing of the waters polluted by small-scale illegal mining in Ghana. Join us to pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the province and their communities. We remember and pray for the ministries of the various groups in the Church, the Mothers' Union, the Men Ministries, the Youth and Children ministries as well as the ministries of theological education and others, that they all will be sources of healing and fruitfulness especially during the month of the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace.

- Psalm 29.11

In the third week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace the Church and constituent countries of CPWA. We pray for the peaceful co-existence of the various political, tribal and faith groups in the constituent countries of the province and between the countries and their neighbours. We pray for all efforts to sustain peace after the Presidential and Parliamentary Elections in Ghana (which took place on 7 December) and pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the countries of the province and its peoples will know and

experience the peace of Christ in challenging political and socio-economic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well as political parties and faith groups in the countries and for the betterment of the nations and their people

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honour one another above yourselves.

— Romans 12.9-10

In the fourth week of the month, we pray for an endearing love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses and countries in the province of West Africa. Join us to pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and countries of the province. We pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and faith, tribal and social communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Additional Prayers

Thanksgiving and Celebration

- Diocese of Asante Mampong (Internal Province of Ghana)

 Join us to give thanks to God for the commencement of new ministries for our dear Brothers Benedict Doku Ntiamoah into the Diaconate and the Rev Emmanuel Appiah Frimpong into Priesthood in the Diocese of Asante Mampong. The service was presided over by the Lord Bishop of Asante Mampong who is also the Primate of CPWA and he was assisted by the visiting Archbishop of York, the Most Rev Stephen Cottrell, the Lord Bishop of Wiawso (Ghana) and the former Bishop of Birmingham. We pray for abundant grace as our brothers join the ordained ministry to serve Christ and His Church
- Diocese of Kumasi (Internal Province of Ghana)

 Join us to pray for our five brothers who have been admitted into the Order of Priests in the Anglican Diocese of Kumasi within the Internal Province of Ghana in the Church of the Province of West Africa. The sacrament of Ordination was administered by the Rt Rev Dr Festus Yeboah-Asuamah, Bishop of the Diocese of

Sunyani. The Diocese of Kumasi is the second oldest Diocese in Ghana, having been carved out of Accra in 1973. Join us to pray for these new priests and their ministries.

Join us to pray for relief efforts after a rainstorm devastated the Mpondasi Anglican School and part of the Cathedral of the Diocese of Upper Shire in Malawi. The devastation disrupted teaching and learning in the Anglican School, affecting over 1,400 children. We thank God no one was harmed. The Cathedral was saved by the trees in front of it as the branches were strewn all over. Without the trees, it would have been a different story, according to the Bishop. "The three trees I planted on my enthronement in May are being nurtured. Let us plant trees" says the Bishop.

Various Prayers

We join the leadership of the Anglican Church of Tanzania to give thanks for the success of their Provincial Synod which took place from 21 to 23 November. Thank God for the deliberations and resolutions arrived at. Pray also for grace towards the implementation of these resolutions and decisions. Let us join the Church in Tanzania as they prepare for the programme of Reconciliation following the Indo-Arabia Slave Trade.

We join IAMA to give thanks to God for the success of their provincial synod that elected the Rt Rev Vicente Msosa as the next Primate of the Church. Bishop Vicente replaces the Most Rev Carlos Matshine who concluded his tenure of office last October. Let us pray for wisdom and grace as Bishop Vicente leads IAMA in mission and ministry

We join the Church and the people of Ghana to pray for peace after their Presidential and Parliamentary Elections which took place on Saturday 7 December. The economy and the environmental concerns about illegal mining are the key issues taking centre stage in the elections. The two main contestants, Dr Mahumudu Bawumia (the current Vice President) of the new Patriotic Party and Mr John Mahama (Former President) of the National Democratic Congress have signed a pact to accept the outcome of the elections and to ensure peace during and after the elections

Let us join the people of Mozambique to pray for peace following the post-election violence that has engulfed the nation. Let us pray for understanding and consensus among the various parties and the civil society groups.
