Who are ABM's Partners?


- We thank our Heavenly Father for the leadership of our General Secretary, Mr Dennis Kabekabe, who will be retiring by the end of this month.

♣ Pray for Bishop-elect James Boliget as he prepares to be ordained and consecrated as the Bishop of Central Philippines on 25 July, and especially that he may faithfully proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom by representing Christ and his Church; guarding the faith, unity, and discipline of the whole Church; proclaiming the Word of God; acting in Christ's name for the reconciliation of the world and the building up of the Church; and ordaining others to continue Christ's ministry.



- Give thanks for 100 years of the Vacation Church School program in the Philippines and pray that it may continue to be an inspiring and life-giving tool for the teaching and nurturing of young believers.
- Pray for the victims of labour trafficking, especially the hundreds of Filipinos lured to Canada by The Promise Land Consultancy (TPLC), that they will come forward and join the network of other victims and their supporters to help seek justice in Canada and in the Philippines, that their money will be fully refunded and payment for damages will be received, and that these governments will transform this unjust structure of society by prioritizing the protection of worker victims and implementing stringent policies to combat labour trafficking.
- Pray for the over 26 million enrolled students in the Philippines who are confronted with the multifaceted impacts of climate change, including El Nino bringing intolerable heat, more powerful typhoons, and limited access to water for basic needs, and that government action will ensure that they have uninterrupted access to quality education.
