Who are ABM's Partners?

The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Church of the Province of the Indian Ocean

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves.

— Luke 22.26

We come into the sixth month of the year with joy and great expectations. In this new month we invite you to stand with us in prayer for the Church of the Province of Indian Ocean. Join us to give thanks for the ministry and mission of the Church under the leadership of the Primate, the Most Rev Dr James Wong, his College of Bishops and others who share in the leadership of the church in the constituent dioceses in Madagascar, Mauritius and Seychelles. Join us to pray for the national, community and sectional leaders in the countries of the province, especially for the Rev Canon Wavel Ramkalawan, the President of the Republic of Seychelles, who together with the church, work towards the peace of the nations and provide accountable leadership and stewardship of God's people. Join us to pray for wisdom and for any virtue that these leaders need to shepherd the people of faith and none and that enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they will pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith, clan and sectional communities. Join us to pray for godly leadership in the missional, institutional and socio-economic development efforts in all dioceses in the province and in the countries that constitute the province.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

Nevertheless, I will bring health and healing to it; I will heal my people and will let them enjoy abundant peace and security.

— Jeremiah 33.6

In the second week of the month, we pray that God will make his people in the churches in Madagascar, Mauritius and Seychelles to be fruitful, to increase and multiply and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's guidance as the region prepares for the cyclone season and the devastation often associated with the season. We remember and pray for the many people who seasonally migrate from their communities to seek protection from the ravages of the times and seasons within the region. Let us pray for the

various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically with the region and province.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

- Philippians 4.6-7

In the third week of June, we invite you to pray for the peace of the constituent nations and dioceses of the province. We pray for God's peace to undergird and rule in the church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life molding actions and within the various institutions of the nations. Let us pray that all the countries and their people will know and experience the peace of Christ during difficult and challenging socioeconomic context in especially Madagascar and the other countries. Let us pray for peaceful social and political relations between various ethnic groups and peoples in the countries of the province for the betterment of the nations and their people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments.

— Deuteronomy 7.9

In the fourth week of the month, join us to pray for endearing love among the various sections and people of the various dioceses and nations of the province. Let us pray for love among people of differing faith, tribe, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent parishes, dioceses and countries of the province. Pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that various policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Additional Prayers

Thanksgiving and Celebration

- Join CAPA and ABM/AID to thank God for the success of the joint Partners' visit to Zambia and Kenya from 14 April to 1 May. The Australian Board of Mission/ Anglicans in Development (ABM/AID) has been partnering with the Zambia Anglican Council Outreach Programme (ZACOP) and the Anglican Development Services, Eastern Kenya (ASDE) to develop and implement various initiatives aimed at securing livelihoods, promoting gender equity and inclusion (including empowerment of women and People With Disabilities (PWD) in various communities in the two countries. The visits highlighted the socioeconomic disparities among communities in the two countries and the mission of the Church to bridge the gaps between communities and groups as well as work towards ending practices that are inimical to the development and advancement of the members of the communities (especially issues related to GBV, Child Marriages, Unequal access to social infrastructure and services) as well as promoting Climate-smart agriculture and actions to secure livelihoods.
- Join the Green Anglicans Movement, Africa (GAMA) to give thanks to God for the successful launch of its EcoTheology Study Booklet which took place on 23 April 2024. The Study Booklet is the contribution of GAMA to discourses on the need for Church action to safeguard the integrity of creation and to work towards Wholesome Creation.

New Ministries

- We join the Diocese of Upper Shire (Malawi) in the Church of the Province of Central Africa to pray towards the installation and enthronement of their new Bishop, the Rt. Rev. William Joseph Mchombo. He joins the Diocese of Upper Shire from the Diocese of Eastern Zambia where he has been the Diocesan Bishop for the last 21 years. Join us to pray that his new ministry will bring about healing and restoration in the Diocese of Upper Shire and for the growth of the Church in Malawi in general.
- We join the Anglican Diocese of Cameroon, under the leadership of the Rt Rev Thomas Elango Dibo to give thanks to God for the successful completion of their Diocesan Centre. The Centre was commissioned and inaugurated on Sunday, 12 May 2024 and we ask for your prayers in support of this new ministry in the Diocese of Cameroon.

Other Prayers

Join us to thank God for the efforts of the Green Anglicans Movement in the Diocese of Lake Malawi (Lilongwe South Archdeaconry) in cleaning the Dedza District Hospital and to grow trees as part of their support to the mission and ministry of the hospital.

Join the Diocese of eSwatini and CAPA to thank God for the success of the Leadership Envisioning Process towards the uptake of the CCMP (Church Community Mobilisation Process) in the diocese. Thank God for the commitment of the Diocesan Bishop and her leaders as well as the selected persons to be trained as Facilitators of the process as evident from the practice session. Please give thanks for the Facilitators training that began on 2 June 2024.

Prayer Requests from Various Provinces

Tanzania

❖ We uphold in prayer the people in the communities of Tanganyika who have been affected by the recent floods in the country. Let us pray that God will provide for the affected individuals, families and communities as well the nation during these trying moments and especially as the weatherman has warned of further rains in the coming months.

Kenya

- The news of the recent floods in Kenya is heartbreaking. At the last count, over 170 people have died in the floods, over 196 have been declared missing while over 6000 have been displaced. These figures are those who have officially been recorded but it is believed that there are many more who have not made it onto the official statistics. As the waters recede, we pray that people who had been washed away will be recovered so they can be given descent burials and their families would have closures while those who were swept away but managed to survive will be found.
- Join us to pray for the government and various county, community and sectarian leaders to rise up to the occasion in the midst of the devastating havoc caused by the floods. Join us to pray for leadership to accept responsibility for their part in the system failures that have led to some of the havocs experienced. The systems that have failed (especially in the urban areas) include poor infrastructure, uncontrolled and poor planning and physical development oversight and individual disregard for the rules of engagement and maintenance. This is particularly important against the backdrop of the forecast of further rains.
- On a sad note, we invite you to pray for the repose of the soul of Bishop Emeritus the Rt Rev Stephen Njihia Mwangi, the 4th Diocesan Bishop of Nakuru, which occurred in the early morning of 2 May 2024 in Nairobi. Please bear the immediate and extended families, the diocese and the entire province of Kenya in prayers as they have laid the late bishop to rest. May he rest in peace and rise in glory in Christ Jesus.

CAPA

Please pray for the CAPA Secretariat as we face dire financial situation made worse by the recent floods that inundated parts of the office and destroyed a number of

- legacy records. As further rains are predicted, pray for the safety of the CAPA House whose structural integrity has been affected by the various highrise building whose basement parking have been dug below the level of the foundation of our building, thus compromising the stability of our structure.
- Join us to continue praying for the work of the Planning Committee of the CAPA 2025 Tripple Event 13th CAPA Assembly, CAPA@45 and the Third All Africa Bishops' Conference (AABC III) all to be held in 2025. Pray for the leaders of the various action Committees as they commence the uptake of their various tasks towards the planning, implementation and accounting for successful events.


