



Located in the courtyard of Seoul Cathedral, this coffee shop supports North Korean defector women in achieving economic independence and adapting to South Korean society. Please pray that through Café Grace, these individuals may find stability and experience God's love and grace.
- 22 March: Busan Diocese Mothers' Union Annunciation Choir Festival: On 22 March, the Busan Diocese Mothers' Union will hold a choir festival in celebration of the Annunciation. Please pray that all members may unite in praising God and participate in the event with joy. On the same day and at the same venue, the National Mothers' Union 100th Anniversary Planning and Executive Committees will meet. Pray that under the Lord's guidance, the committees may prepare well for the 100th-anniversary celebration in September.

The Anglican Church of Melanesia


- Pray for the success of the safeguarding policy socialisation this month to all the religious orders.

- **Support for Affected Dioceses:** Of our nine dioceses, eight are located in war zones. Pray for the displaced individuals and refugees in these areas, including our church members.
- Church Resilience: The ongoing civil war has severely impacted the church in Myanmar—socially, economically, financially, psychologically, and spiritually. Pray for strength and resilience during these challenging times.
- Protection for Youth: Many young people are attempting to evade conscription laws by fleeing to neighboring countries, often without proper documentation. Pray for their safety and for their parents, who are experiencing immense distress.
- ↔ Archbishop's Safety: Pray for the Archbishop, who leads the Christian Peace Supporting Committee and faces threats to his life.
- Construction Projects: CPM has to build a church, an Anglican Peace Center, and a parsonage on government-donated land. These projects are to be completed within four to five years, despite lacking firm financial security. Pray for the necessary resources and support.
- + Christian Unity: Pray for all Christian churches in Myanmar to unite in Christ.



The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- Give thanks for the successful celebration marking the 28th anniversary of the concordat of Full Communion between The Episcopal Church in the Philippines and the Iglesia Filipina Independiente (Philippine Independent Church), and pray that together they can more effectively proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom to the Filipino people.
- ↔ Give thanks for the increasing numbers of active Lay Ministers volunteering their time as bible study facilitators and worship

leaders in the Episcopal Diocese of Santiago, and pray that as they strive to identify opportunities to expand their mission and ministry alongside their clergy that opportunities to teach, baptise and nurture new believers will also arise.

- Pray for the successful installation of The Rt. Rev. Nestor D. Poltic as the 8th Prime Bishop of The Episcopal Church in the Philippines on March 12, and especially for the ministry and witness of the province under his leadership.
- Give thanks for the ministry of Migrante International and pray especially for the success of its worldwide campaign in support of a family living wage in the Philippines as it strives to transform unjust structures of society.

The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Provinces of Burundi and Rwanda

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Do you see someone skilled in their work? They will serve before kings; they will not serve before officials of low rank. – Proverbs 22.29

We come into the third month of the year with gratitude to God for His faithfulness, and his bounteous graces and mercies showered on us so far. We come into the month of February lifting up prayers before the Lord for the Provinces of Burundi and Rwanda under the leadership of Most Rev Sixbert Macumi (Burundi) and Most Rev Dr Laurent Mbanda (Rwanda). We remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and Lay Leaders who (together with the Primates) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Churches in Burundi and Rwanda and their communities. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nations. Let us pray that the leaders will provide accountable leadership and stewardship even as we pray for wisdom for them to shepherd the people of faith and none. Let us pray particularly at this time of crisis between Rwanda and Burundi with their neighbour, the Democratic Republic of Congo, that being enlightened by the Holy Spirit, the Church will lead in the pursuit of justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.

– Isaiah 53.5

In the second week of March, we pray for fruitfulness, good health and mercy for God's people in Burundi and Rwanda. We pray that the countries and their peoples will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families

and communities affected by the recurrent challenges occasioned by the protracted conflicts in DR Congo and those affected by political and economic instability in the countries of Burundi and Rwanda. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by displacements occasioned by the insurgency in eastern DR Congo which has spilled over into Burundi and Rwanda and for those who have been displaced from DR Congo and are being hosted by the Church and communities in Burundi and Rwanda. Join us to pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the provinces and their communities. We remember and pray for the ministries of the various groups in the Church, the Mothers' Union, the Men Ministries, the Youth and Children ministries and their support in bringing healing and hope to those who suffer.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. – Isaiah 26.3

In the third week of the month of March, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of the Church and the constituent dioceses of the provinces of Burundi and Rwanda. We pray for the peaceful co-existence of the various political, tribal and faith groups in the countries of Burundi and Rwanda and between the countries and their neighbours. We pray for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups and pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the countries of Burundi and Rwanda and their peoples will know and experience the peace of Christ in their challenging political and socio-economic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well as political parties and faith groups in the countries and for the betterment of the nations and their people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. – Colossians 3.14

In the fourth week of March, we pray for endearing love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses and communities in the provinces of Burundi and Rwanda. We pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another

and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Additional Prayers

Thanksgiving and Celebration

✤ Diocese of Lesotho

We join the Female Africa Bishops (Africa Six), along with mission partners to give thanks to God for the success of their gathering in the Diocese of Lesotho to collaboratively explore and develop innovative strategies aimed at empowering and uplifting women, particularly in leadership roles. Their shared vision is to create a church that embodies essential principles such as accountability, safety and inclusivity for all congregants in their areas of influence as Bishops. Of the six Female Bishops, four(4) are Diocesan Bishops in Lesotho, Eswatini, Diocese of the Good Shepherd (Angola) and Buteri (Kenya) while the other two are Assistant Bishops in the Dioceses of Bondo (Kenya) and Rumbek (South Sudan). Join us to continue to pray for them and their ministries.

+ Anglican Development Services – Eastern Kenya

We join the Anglican Development Services, Eastern Kenya (ADSE) to give thanks to God for the impact of their community empowerment programme with the support from the ANGLICAN BOARD OF MISSION - AUSTRALIA through the Australian Government through the Australian NGO Cooperation Program (ANCP). The programme seeks to empower communities in rural areas in Eastern Kenya through trainings on group leadership, financial management, recordkeeping, conflict resolution and group dynamics to promote community cohesion and Village Saving and Loaning Activities .The trainings have changed their lives and <u>here is a case</u> of Mutuku Nzambu, a member of the Kyumbuke CBO of Kyua Location of Machakos County. In addition, ADSE's interventions support access to potable water, agroforestry and climate-smart interventions in the arid and semi-arid communities in Eastern Kenya. ADSE is part of ADSK which is the development arm of the Anglican Church of Kenya.

✤ Democratic Republic of Congo

Join us to pray for peace in the Democratic Republic of Congo and among their neighbours - Rwanda, Burundi and Uganda who share a common border in the eastern part of the country. At least 773 people have been reported killed with over 2500 people displaced in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo's (DRC) largest city of Goma and its vicinity in a week, amid fighting with Rwanda-backed M23 rebels who captured the city in a serious escalation of a decade-long conflict, authorities said. According to official reports from DR Congo, "these figures remain provisional because the rebels asked the population to clean the streets of Goma. There should be mass graves and the Rwandans took care to evacuate theirs," a Congolese government spokesman, Patrick Muyaya told a briefing on Saturday (1 February) in the capital Kinshasa, adding that the death toll could be higher. M23 is the most potent of more than 100 armed groups vying for control in DRC's mineral-rich east, which holds vast deposits critical to much of the world's technology. They are backed by about 4,000 troops from neighbouring Rwanda, according to United Nations experts. Recent updates report no water, electricity and no internet connectivity in Goma, making the humanitarian situation dire. A statement by the Rt. Rev. Martin Gordon, Bishop of Goma, shed more light on the situation there and issued the international Goma Call for Peace. In a related incident, there has been a joint Protestants Catholics collaborative initiative to launch roadmap to seeking lasting peace in the Congo conflict which has been raging since 1997.

+ Church of the Province of Central Africa – Green Anglicans Malawi We join our brothers and sisters in the GREEN ANGLICANS MALAWI to thank God for the success of their 1 February 2025 initiative of cleaning parts of the Kawale community in Malawi. Together with 60 passionate volunteers, the Green Anglicans conducted a major plastic waste clean-up at Kawale Market and Hospital area showing exactly why the thin plastics ban matters. Earlier last two years, the Green Anglicans in Malawi, with the support of the Anglican Church and other agencies, secured a landmark court ruling banning single-use and thin plastics in Malawi. The clean-up exercise was a practical demonstration of the commitment of the Church and agents to ensure the enforcement of the court ruling and to create further awareness and sensitization among the populace of the negative impact of the use of thin plastics. We join the leadership of the Green Anglicans to say a massive thank you to everyone who braved the heat to join in the exercise. The enthusiasm was simply incredible! Special mention to the amazing youth volunteers and market leaders who worked tirelessly to make this happen. Invitation goes out to all to join in the Church's mission to Care for God's Creation.

✤ The Diocese of Upper Shire, Malawi

The Diocesan Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Upper Shire (and Eco-Bishop), has mobilized the youth in the Diocese to adopt and plant grass around the Diocesan Centre as part of his efforts to grow, empower and sensitize the youth on creation care and to also protect and make the Diocesan Centre eco-friendly. Bishop William Joseph Mchombo is on of the active Eco-Bishops in the Church of the Province of Central Africa (Botswana, Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe). His enthusiasm for the Care of Creation is typically exemplified from his home, where together with his family he has created a green space in their home through the enthusiastic growing of trees and ornaments which serves both to protect the environment and to also serve as an economic opportunity for the family

↔ Church of the Province of the Indian Ocean

We join the Province of the Indian Ocean (Madagascar, Mauritius and Seychelles) to give thanks to God for the success of their Provincial Synod held in Mahajanga, in Madagascar during which Archbishop James Wong brought his tenure as Primate to a close and a new Primate, the Most Rev Dr Gilbert Rateloson, Bishop of the Diocese of Fianarantsoa (Madagascar) was elected the new Primate. He was installed Cathedral in Fianarantsoa on 19 January 2025
