## The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia

#### Te Hahi Mihinare ki Aotearoa ki Niu Tireni, ki Nga Moutere o Te Moana Nui a Kiwa

- We give thanks for the Wellington City Mission and its brandnew, purpose-built community hub and social housing apartment building known as *Whakamaru* which will shortly open its doors to anyone and everyone.
- We pray for the Diocese of Polynesia as it prepares for the forthcoming annual Pacific Tropical Cyclone season. Thank you for the commitment the Diocese and Anglican Missions have put into ensuring that parishes are increasingly resilient.
- We pray for all victims of abuse and acknowledge the commitment from Church leaders to addressing the findings of fault against the Anglican Church which are recorded in the Royal Commission of Inquiry into Abuse in Care's report Whanaketia Whakairihia ki te tihi o Maung rongo ('Through pain and trauma, from darkness to light').
- We continue to pray for the coalition of agencies led by the Anglican Alliance and the Diocese of Jerusalem and which includes Anglican Missions and Anglican Board of Missions. ## The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Anglican Church of Tanzania



#### WEEK 1

#### A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

— Hebrews 13.7

We thank God for bringing us into the eleventh month of the year and with gratitude, we invite you to join us to pray for the Anglican Church of Tanzania under the leadership of the Most Rev Dr Maimbo Mndolwa. We pray for the College of Bishops and all others who share in the leadership of the churches in the constituent dioceses of the Anglican Church of Tanzania. Join us to pray for the national, community, faith and sectional leaders in the country of Tanzania who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and peace of the nation and to provide accountable leadership and stewardship. We pray for wisdom for these leaders as they shepherd the people of faith and none, that they may be enlightened by the Holy Spirit to pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities, and clans.

#### WEEK 2

#### A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. – Proverbs 17.22

In the second week of the month, we pray that God will make His people in the Anglican Church of Tanzania and its constituent dioceses to be fruitful, to increase and multiply in all their undertakings and to be healed of all their infirmities and diseases, especially those that plague people in the various dioceses and under different circumstances. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the recurrent challenges caused by both human and natural disasters including those affected by the impact of Climate Change and other such incidents. Join us to pray for the safety of women, girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenging situations in the constituent dioceses of the Anglican Church of Tanzania. We remember and pray for the many people who have migrated from their communities and countries to seek security and safety. We remember and pray especially for those fleeing vicious atrocities in Cabo Delgado (Mozambique) and have been forced to take refuge in Tanzania. Let us pray for the various health and healing

ministries of the Church and for all whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the Anglican Church of Tanzania's dioceses and their respective dioceses and communities. We pray for the ministries of the various groups in the Church, the Mothers' Union, the Youth and Children ministries as well as the ministries of theological education and others, that they all will be sources of healing and fruitfulness.

#### WEEK 3

#### **A Prayer for Peace**

Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times in every way. The Lord be with you all.

- 2 Thessalonians 3.16

In the third week of the month of November, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of Tanzania, as a country and for the communities and dioceses of the Anglican Church. We pray for the peaceful co-existence of the various tribal and faith groups in Tanzania and between the country and its neighbours. We pray for God's peace to underpin and rule in the Church and in the nation and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that Tanzania and its peoples will know and experience the peace of Christ in the challenging political and socioeconomic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well political parties and faith groups in the country and for the betterment of the nations and their people.

#### WEEK 4

#### **A Prayer for Love**

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.

— John 13.34

This fourth week of November, we pray for endearing love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses in the Anglican Church of Tanzania and the constituent dioceses of the province. We pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses of the Church. Let us pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and faith, tribal and social communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

#### Thanksgiving and Celebration

- +‡+ Synod of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa: We join the Anglican Church of Southern Africa to give thanks to God for the successful holding of the 37th Session of its Provincial Synod (25-27 September) which was preceded by the Episcopal Synod (23-25 September). The synod was attended by delegates from all the 25 dioceses in Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia, South Africa and St Helena, the countries that constitute the province. Among the many decisions and resolutions made was the Call for Ceasefire in Gaza and Palestine and for peaceful resolution of the conflict between Hamas and Israel. The synod also voted to reject the proposed prayers for the blessing of same-sex marriages and to work towards pragmatic Youth Engagements that will inspire hope, build capacity and engender entrepreneurial opportunities for the teeming unemployed youth in the province. The synod also thanked the Bishops of Pretoria and Port Elizabeth for their services as they prepare to retire. Other persons were acknowledged for the various contributions to the life and ministry of various dioceses and groups within the province. Present at the synod were the Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, the General Secretary of USPG and that of CAPA. Copies of the Africa Study Bible were given to all the Bishops in the province.
- New Archbishops and Bishops in the Church of Nigeria: We join the Church of Nigeria (Anglican Communion) to give thanks to God and commend to his gracious mercy the ministries of the new Archbishops and Bishops in various Episcopal provinces and Dioceses in Nigeria.

Join us to pray for them, their families and their new areas of ministry and jurisdiction.

Episcopal Church of South Sudan: Join us to thank God for the success of the ECSS Education Department's workshop (with support from the Liliane Foundation), on how to support and empower children and youths with disabilities in South Sudan. The workshop sought to equip Education stakeholders (through the Education Department of the ECSS) on how to support children and youth with disabilities to be able to access and benefit from formal and inclusive education.

The Christian Initiative for Restoration and Development Agency (CIRDA), has been conducting a series of training on sexual Gender-Based Violence for different denominations across Aweil East County of South Sudan. Currently, more than 100 church leaders have received training. Join us to continue to pray against the ever-rising incidence of GBV and the work of Church and Community Leaders to stem the trend in South Sudan and in other countries in Africa.

We join the members of the Africa Hub of the Ecumenical Network of South Sudan, under the auspices of the All Africa Conference of Churches AACC) to give thanks to God for the success of the ecumenical solidarity visit in support of the South Sudan Council of Churches and to join its leadership in planning for the Council's upcoming General Assembly and election of new leaders. Pray for CAPA's role in the network even as we encourage stronger Anglican involvement through the Episcopal Church of South Sudan.

In the Diocese of Wanyjok in South Sudan, massive flooding resulting from heavy rainfall has destroyed lives and property and displaced large portions of the communities in the diocese. We ask for your prayers for the affected persons and communities and we appeal for your support to enable the diocese to provide relief and humanitarian assistance to the affected persons.

- Anglicans at the Summit of the Future. Ms Grace Maghanga, a member of the Green Anglicans Movement (Kenya), in her blog reflected that, 'Listening to the voices of youth to create a better future,' is the crucial role that the young people played in the Gen-Z protests in Kenya and their importance in shaping national governance. The Most Revd Dr Jackson Ole Sapit reminds us saying 'Let us all work together towards a Kenya where justice, integrity and inclusivity reign supreme, and where the aspirations of each Kenyan, especially our youth, are considered and where all can meaningfully participate in creating the Kenya we want.'
- Ghana Clergy Association (Internal Province of Ghana, Church of the Province of West Africa): We join our brothers and sisters in the Ghana Anglican Clergy Association to give thanks to God for the successful holding of their National Conference from 23rd to 27th September 2024 in Tamale, Northern Ghana. The Conference, under the theme 'Changing the story of the Anglican Clergy' was addressed by the Primate of the Church of the Province of West Africa who is also the Archbishop of the Internal Province of Ghana.

- \*\* National Union of Anglican Students, (Internal Province of Ghana, Church of the Province of West Africa): We thank God for the successful conclusion of the 60th National Congress of the National Union of Anglian Students (NUAS) in the Internal Province of Ghana. The Union brings together Anglicans in secondary and tertiary institutions into an organized body that ministers to the needs of their members and strategizes with the Church on youth engagements. Their anniversary thanksgiving service was held at the St George's Garrison Church of the Burna Camp in Accra.
- Diocese of Northern Zambia (Church of the Province of Central Africa): We join the Rt Rev John Kafwanka and the leadership of his diocese to give thanks to God for the various leadership engagements with the ministry leaders in the diocese. The engagements with the Dean of the Cathedral and the Archdeacons and the leaders of the Mothers' Union, the St Veronica's Guild, Youth and others were to share ideas on the vision of the diocese and how to achieve the vision
- Diocese of Upper Shire, Malawi (Church of the Province of Central Africa): The cost of the impact of Climate Change cannot be over-emphasized and it ranges from drought and its attendant food insecurity for a large number of people (especially those on the margins) to floods and rising water levels in lakes and the sea. This month, we pray for the Diocese of Upper Shire (Malawi) where the rising water level of the lake is eroding the land on which the Diocesan Health Centre is sited and operates. It is now costing the Centre and the Diocese so much to construct a stone defence wall against the rising water levels.

#### **Various Prayers**

- ♣ South Sudan: Join us to pray for the repose of the souls of the victims of the road carnage on the Juba Nimule Road when the bus on which they were travelling to Kampala, Uganda was set ablaze. Pray for God to rest the souls of those who perished in the carnage and for those who have been abducted. May God save their innocent lives and keep them safe wherever they have been taken to and comfort and heal the wounds of those who have injuries on their bodies
- \*Province of Alexandria: We join the Province of Alexandria and its leadership to give thanks to God for their ministry in support of the teeming number of displaced Sudanese who are being hosted by the Church in Egypt. Give thanks to God for the success of the Sudan Pastors Conference held to celebrate and strategize on how best to minister appropriately to the community. Speaking at the conference, Archbishop Samy Shehata (Primate of the Province of Alexandria) observed that advocacy should be at the top of the priority in working towards lasting peace in Sudan
- Anglican Church of Kenya, Diocese of Nairobi: We join the Diocese of Nairobi and the Anglican Church of Kenya to give thanks to God for the life, work and ministry of the Rt Rev Joel Waweru, who retires from ministry as the Bishop of the Diocese of

Nairobi. The service was presided over by the Most Rev Dr Jackson Ole Sapit, Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Kenya. In attendance were Bishops and Church Leaders from the Christian community in Kenya and also the Secretary General of the Anglican Communion, the Rt Rev Anthony Poggo. Join us to wish Bishop Waweru all the best in the next phase of his personal, family and ministerial life. Congratulations, Bishop Joel.

- Green Anglicans Movement, Anglican Church of Southern Africa: Join us to give thanks to God for the ministry of the Green Anglicans Movement in the Anglican Church of Southern Africa; for their work and commitment to promoting actions towards safeguarding the integrity of God's creation. As a sign of their commitment, they provided a tree seedling, which was blessed by the Bishops present at the closing eucharist of the 37th Session of the Provincial Synod to be planted in the Diocese of Highveld.
- Safe Church Conference, Bulawayo, Zimbabwe: Join us to give thanks to God for the success of the Safe Church Conference hosted by the Diocese of Matabeland, Zimbabwe. The conference brought together over 235 participants from across the Anglican Communion to reflect, create awareness and build capacity to position the church and her ministries as safes paces, where the love of Christ is reflected and experienced by all. The conference was hosted by the Church of the Province of Central Africa and organised by the International Safe Church Commission of the Anglican Communion, working with the Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa (CAPA) and the Episcopal Ministry team of the Anglican Communion Office.
- Mothers' Union, Anglican Church of Tanzania: We join the Provincial Mothers' Union office in Tanzania to celebrate and pray towards their ministry and work of coordinating the Church and Community Mobilization Process in 13 Dioceses and reaching over 400 groups. Join them to pray for resources (human and financial) to be able to meet their target of reaching all the 28 Dioceses in the province.
- Anglican Communion Health Network Steering Committee: Give thanks for the successful meeting hosted by the Anglican Church in Hong Kong from 11 to 16 October.
