
- Pray for good leadership and governance for ACPNG and its institutions.

The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan

### WEEK 1

### A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

A leader is best when people barely know he exists, when his work is done, his aim fulfilled, they will say: we did it ourselves. - Lao Tsu

God has guided us into the ninth month of the year and with gratitude, we invite you to join us to pray for the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan. Join us to give thanks for the ministry and mission of the Churches under the leadership of the Most Rev Ezekiel Kondo (Sudan) and the Most Rev Dr Justin Arama Badi (South Sudan) Primates of Sudan and South Sudan respectively. We pray for the College of Bishops and Archbishops and all others who share in the leadership of the churches in Sudan and South Sudan. Join us to pray for the national, community, faith and sectional leaders in the war torn and ravaged countries of Sudan and South Sudan, who together with the church work towards the peace of the nations and to provide accountable leadership and stewardship of God's people. We pray for wisdom for these leaders as they shepherd the people of faith and none, that they may be enlightened by the Holy Spirit to pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities, and clans.

#### WEEK 2

### A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

## So I will turn toward you and make you fruitful and multiply you, and I will confirm My covenant with you. – Leviticus 26.9

In the second week of the month of September, we pray that God will make his people in the Anglican Church and in the nations of Sudan and South Sudan fruitful, to increase and multiply in all their endeavours and to be healed of all their physical, emotional and psychological infirmities and diseases, especially of the trauma associated with the persistent conflicts in the two nations. We pray for God's continued mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the recurrent wars and tribal conflicts, insurgent attacks, and the associated displacement of people groups and communities and their devastating effects on lives and properties. Join us to pray for the safety of women, girls, children and the elderly who are adversely impacted by the wars and tribal conflicts, for families separated by the fighting and for children abducted and drafted as child soldiers. We remember and pray for the many people who have migrated from their communities to seek protection from the ravages of the times and seasons in the country including those fleeing from the activities of bandits and insurgents in Sudan and South Sudan. Let us pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan and the respective countries.

### WEEK 3

### **A Prayer for Peace**

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. – Isaiah 26.3

In the third week of September, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of the nations, communities and dioceses of the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan. We pray for peaceful co-existence of the various tribal and faith groups in the nations of Sudan and South Sudan and between the two nations and their neighbours. We pray for God's peace to undergird and rule in the church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life molding actions and within the various institutions of the nations and the Church. We pray that the nations and their peoples will know and experience the peace of Christ during the current challenging political, and socio-economic circumstances which has resulted in various uprising and protests. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples in the countries of Sudan and South Sudan and for the betterment of the nations and their people.

### WEEK 4

### **A Prayer for Love**

### ... be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you. – Ephesians 4.32

This fourth week of September, we pray for endearing love among the various faiths, tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses in the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan and the nations. We pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses of the Church and of the countries of Sudan and South Sudan. Let us pray that all people will bear the burden of loving one another and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. Let us pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the

church and faith, tribal and social communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

### **Additional Prayers**

### Thanksgiving and Celebration

- Join the Province of Igreja Anglicana de Moçambique e Angola (IAMA) and the Diocese of Libombos, to give thanks to God for the ministry of the Most Revd Carlos Matsinhe, Bishop of the Diocese and acting Primate of the Province who brings his ministry in the two roles to an end in October 2024. At a Valedictory Service held in his honour and in thanksgiving to God in Maputo on July 14, Bishop Anthony Poggo (Secretary General of the Anglican Communion) said "Archbishop Carlos has led this Province and the diocese.... From what I know in the five years that I have worked with him, I see him as a leader who has been humble, patient and led his church well. Thank you, Archbishop for all that you have done for God's Church in this province and in this Anglican Communion." We invite you to join us to pray for the Rt Revd Augusto Domingos of the Diocese of Cristo Rei, the Dean of the Province who will oversee the province during the transition.
- Join CAPA to give thanks to God for the success of the Primates' and Spouses' + Retreat hosted by the Church of Nigeria in Abuja from 11 to 14 July 2024. The theme for the retreat, "CAPA: An instrument of authentic life for Africa" was engaging and forward looking and provided the space for fellowship, reflection on the relevance and mandate of CAPA and CAPA's role as a credible platform for member provinces to share experiences, best practices, and resources from a uniquely African contextual perspective, and to consult about their work and the challenges encountered in the proclamation of the gospel, CAPA's provision of a voice and forum for African Anglican provinces to address common needs facing the continent and to articulate an authentic orthodox theology that aligns with the African cultural context, CAPA's function as an ecclesial body within the global Anglican community, bringing the African Anglican experience and expression to the table whenever the global church convenes, despite differing traditions and ceremonies across Africa. The retreat was addressed by the President of the Africa Development Bank, Dr Akinwumi Adesina who spoke on the topic "Food Security and Financial Sustainability in Africa: the role of the Church".
- ↔ We join the people of South Sudan in giving thanks to God for various efforts at promoting peace, working towards trauma healing and peaceful co-existence of

various tribal groups in the country. We give thanks to God for the success of the three-day trauma healing training for various community leaders in the Diocese of Rokon. The training was organized by the South Sudan Council of Churches (SSCC) and was facilitated by resources persons drawn form various groups across the spectrum of the Equatorial Region of South Sudan.

- ✤ Let us join the Diocese of Kampala (Church of Uganda) who successfully held a training and commissioning workshop for their Diocesan Green Anglicans Movement Champions and Chaplains. As these Champions and Chaplains commence their work, join us to pray for grace for all they aspire for and do to steward God's creation (5th Mark of Mission of the Anglican Church)
- Following the recent demonstrations by the Gen Zs in Kenya, the Anglican Church of Kenya led by the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Jackson Ole Sapit issued a statement which in part read "Let us all work together towards a Kenya where justice, integrity and inclusivity reign supreme, and where the aspirations of each Kenyan, especially our youth, are considered and where all can meaningfully participate in creating the Kenya we want. Let us promote an all-inclusive engagement and support a rebirth of Kenya that serves all, not one that works like a limited company serving a collusion of political elites." The statement was made on 19 July, on behalf of the Kenyan House of Bishops. It also called for the Anglican Church to dedicate Sunday 21 July, for prayers and fasting. Let us continue praying for Kenya and her leaders, especially for the leadership of the church.
- Join CAPA and the Commission on Theological Education in the Anglican Communion (CTEAC) to thank God for the success of the consultative workshop held in Limuru, Kenya between 14 and 17 July 2024. The workshop themed "Equipping for Mission" set in motion the process of Provinces and their theological education institutions to develop contextually appropriate resources for training ordained and lay leaders in key areas of mission. Five thematic areas of focus for the workshop were Intentional Discipleship, Science and Faith, Safe Church and Safe Guarding, Slavery to Freedom and Reconciliation. Participants for the workshop were from the provinces of Burundi, Central Africa, Indian Ocean, IAMA, Kenya, Southern Africa, Sudan, Tanzania and West Africa, with partners from USPG and the Episcopal Church.
- Let us join the Diocese of Upper Shire (Malawi) to give thanks to God for the success of their maiden Clergy and Spouses' Fellowship for peace held at the Holy Trinity Church, Liwonde. Addressing the group, the Diocesan Bishop, the Rt Rev William Mchombo highlighted the Church's mission as a peacemaker and reconciler and emphasized the fact that while reconciliation is at the heart of the Christian faith, conflict resolution is crucial in addressing disagreements and disputes that may arise within the church.
- ✤ We join the Diocese of Kubwa (Church of Nigeria) to give thanks to God for the success of their Diocesan Synod hosted by the Karshi Archdeaconry and under the

leadership of the Rt Rev Dr Duke Akamikoso. Join us to pray that all decisions arrived at and being implemented will foster the growth of the diocese and the expansion of God's kingdom here on earth and in particular in the Kubwa diocese.

### **New Ministries**

- We join the Association of Anglican Church Choirs, Ghana and the Rev Fr Benjamin Nii Lante Kumi-Bruce to give thanks to God on his appointment and installation as the National Chaplain of the Association. The installation Service, conducted by the Rt Rev Dr Daniel Sylvanus Torto, the Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Accra, empowers Rev Fr Kumi-Bruce (an astute Musician) to provide spiritual leadership of the Association. The Association of Anglican Church Choirs brings together Diocesan Choirs from the 13 Anglican Dioceses in Ghana for fellowship and mutual support in their ministries as choristers in the Anglican Church.
- Join us to pray for the upcoming installation service of the Dean Designate, the Rev Bulelwa Shilali-Woolley as the Dean of the Cathedral Church of Christ in the Diocese of St Mark the Evangelist in the Anglican Church of Southern Africa. Let us pray for the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Thabo Makgoba, the Diocesan Bishop, the Houses of Clergy and Laity and all the faithful in the diocese as well as the immediate and extended family and circle of friends of the new Dean. Importantly, let us pray for God's abounding grace for the various ministries in the Cathedral, the Diocese of St Mark and in the Anglican Church of Southern Africa.
- Join us to thank God for the new ministry of the Ven Okechukwu Godson Okoye, who on 9 July 2024 was promoted to the rank of Air Commodore, making him the first Anglican clergyman in the Church of Nigeria to achieve such a high rank within the Air Force. The promotion, announced by Air Vice Marshal Edward Gabkwet, Director of Public Relations and Information for the Nigerian Air Force, comes in recognition of Ven Okoye's "unparalleled dedication and loyalty" throughout his service. Okoye's career began in 1986 as a church teacher in Anambra State. Following ordination in the Church of Nigeria, he joined the Nigerian Air Force in 1999 and completed training at the Nigerian Defence Academy in Kaduna. Since his commissioning as a Flying Officer, Ven Okoye has served as a chaplain in various NAF units, including pioneering the Protestant arm of the NAF Chaplaincy Directorate.
- Join us to commit to the Lord our Brothers in Christ and ministry, the Revd Prebendary John Kafwanka, the Revd Canon Dennis Milanzi and the Revd Canon Emmanuel Chikoya all of who will be ordained and consecrated into episcopal ministry within the Church of the Province of Central Africa and within the Zambia Anglican Council.

The Revd Prebendary John Kafwanka will be ordained as the substantive Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Northern Zambia headquartered in Kitwe. Prior to his election, Prebendary John was the Vicar of St Augustine Church, Whitton in the Diocese of London. He had earlier served as the Director of Mission at the Anglican Communion Office and the CMS-UK Manager for Southern Africa.

The Revd Canon Dennis Milanzi will be substantive Bishop of the Diocese of Eastern Zambia. Prior to his election, Canon Milanzi was the Director of Theological Education by Extension, Zambia (TEEZ), a ministry he has grown beyond Zambia and how has outposts in DR Congo and other places in Africa.

The Revd Canon Emmanuel Chikoya will be Suffragan Bishop of the Diocese of Lusaka. Prior to his election, Canon Chikoya served as the General Secretary of the Christian Council of Zambia (CCZ), the ecumenical body that brings together the Christian denominations in Zambia for fellowship and common action.

Their joint episcopal ordination and consecration service will be held at the Cathedral Church of the Holy Cross in Lusaka, Zambia on Sunday 25 August 2024. Please pray for them, the Church, their families and the dioceses they will be leading.

### **Recent and Ongoing Events**

- We join our prayers with those of the Church of Nigeria in giving thanks for the All Anglican Clergy Conference under the theme: "Maintaining Anglican Heritage and Identity in times like this". Give thanks for the Primate of All Nigeria, the College of Archbishops and Bishops and the Clergy from the 165 dioceses in Nigeria who travelled from various places to participate in the conference. The conference took place from 5 to 9 August in Lagos.
- Join us to continue praying for the on-going Partners-in-Resilience and Relief (PiRR) training being hosted and facilitated by CAPA, the Anglican Alliance (AA) and the Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD). The ten months long training aims to equip and empower various actors and stakeholders with knowledge and skills to be able to respond to incidence of disaster (of any form) in their context. The training will also develop capacity for accompanying dioceses, countries or provinces in the event of disaster.
- We invite you to pray for the on-going Climate Change webinars that seek to address practical ways in which the Church can and is responding to Climate Change in their context. The first webinar came off on Tuesday, July 30, 2024 and will happen every last Tuesday of each months until November. The first webinar was attended by over 50 participants from the CAPA provinces. ### **Prayer Requests from Various Provinces**

### Kenya

Let us continue to pray for Kenya following the actions by the Gen Z and although there is an uneasy calm, things and times are just unpredictable as no one seems to know the next line of action by the group. There are also concerns being raised about some of their actions such as Occupy JKIA (the International Airport) and the rationale behind those actions. Let us pray for wisdom, right discernment and leadership in the activities of the group.

### Nigeria/Rwanda

 Join us to give thanks for the success of the Bishops' and Spouses' Retreat of the Province of Rwanda held in Abuja, Nigeria between 22 and 31 July 2024 under the theme "Shepherding God's flock" (Acts 20.18-35). The retreat was attended by 10 Bishops and 9 Spouses and was hosted by the Diocese of Abuja.

### Nigeria

✤ We bring to God in prayer, the Church of Nigeria and her ministries. We giver thanks for these two events: The Anglican Chancellors' and Registrars' Conference that took place from late July till 1 August on the theme, "To whom shall we go ; and the Health Summit on the theme, "Health Prosperity through UHC in the Decade of God's reign" which took place in mid-August in Abuja.

### CAPA

- Join CAPA to give thanks for their partnership with Ripple Effect (originally called Send a Cow), a partnership that will explore and link member dioceses and their ministries to appropriate initiatives being championed by Ripple Effect. Areas of common interest and action will include Community Development, Economic Empowerment (using CAPA's Wegrow Africa platform for VSLAs). Pray for the twoyear workplan that has been developed and will soon be launched.
